Introducing the New Speaker of the House

Dave Levac was born and raised in the southwestern Ontario community of Brantford, where he continues to live with his wife, Rosemarie. They have three adult children.

After teaching elementary and secondary school for 12 years, Dave became an elementary school principal in 1989. In his capacity as a principal, Dave developed conflict resolution programs

for which, among other accomplishments, he received a Distinguished Teacher Award in 1994.

In addition to his teaching career, Dave took an active leadership role in his community through involvement in a number of local non-profit organizations including the Heart & Stroke Foundation, the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, the United Way, and the Thank-A-Vet luncheon committee, the Parkinson Society of Canada, Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Brant and the Telephone City Car Show. He also founded and chaired the Friends of the Firefighters Committee, initiating a number of successful fundraising campaigns for the Brantford and Brant Fire Departments. In recognition for his community work, he was named Brant and Brantford's Citizen of the Year by the Brantford Expositor newspaper in 1997.



First elected to the Ontario Legislature in 1999 as the MPP for the riding of Brant, Dave has since been re-elected three times. At the Legislature, he has held positions as the Public Safety & Security Critic, Chief Government Whip and Chair of the Cabinet's Education Committee and the Chair of the Economic, Environment, and Resources Policy Committee. He also served as the Parliamentary Assistant for the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services and later, the Minister of Energy and Infrastructure.

During his career as a legislator, Dave was a member of two inter-parliamentary organizations: the Ontario-US Parliamentary Association and the Ontario-Quebec Parliamentary Association where he served as Vice-Chair. He will remain an active member of both as Speaker

Dave became Ontario's 41st Speaker on November 21st, 2011. As well as presiding over the Legislature, Speaker Levac chairs the Board of Internal Economy. Composed of MPPs from the three political parties, this committee is responsible for all financial and administrative matters relating to the Legislative Assembly. The Speaker also has a diplomatic role, welcoming visiting dignitaries to the Legislative Building and representing Ontario's parliament both in Canada and abroad.

APRIL 2012 MONTHLY UPDATE

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

Peter Kormos is the former NDP member for Wellend. He was elected as an Ontario New Democratic Party Member of Provincial Parliament to the Legislative Assembly of Ontario in 1988. He was a practicing criminal lawyer and a local Wellend city councillor before. Under Bob Rae's government, Kormos' was appointed to cabinet as Minister of Consumer and Commercial Relations and Minister of Financial Institutions. Although the NDP were defeated in 1995, Kormos popularity continued. He sought NDP leadership but lost.

He was House Leader for the Ontario NDP Caucus from 2001 to retirement in 2011. He also held positions in the while serving NDP in opposition. This year, he was elected to the Niagara Regional Council in a byelection.



David Ramsay just retired from politics in 2011. His political career has a rich history. Ramsay was first elected to the Legislative Assembly of Ontario in 1985. He was part of the Ontario New Democratic Party, representing the Timikaming Riding, part of the change from the Tory stronghold in northern Ontario in the 1980s. In 1986, Ramsay joined the Liberals and won reelection in 1987, becoming part of Premier David Peterson's cabinet. He was the Ontario Minister of Correctional Services and then the Ontario Minister of Agriculture and Food. He kept his seat when Bob Rae's government came into power. In 1992 he ran for leadership of the Liberal Party, supporting things like equity measures, but lost. He won seats again in 1995 and 1999, was chair of the caucus from 1993 to 1994 and 1999 to 2003. When the Liberals won in 2003, Ramsay

became the Ontario Minister of Natural Resources. In 2007, he became Ontario's first Minister of Aboriginal Affairs. After the provincial election that year, he became Premier Dalton McGuinty's Parliamentary Assistant.

After retirement, Ramsay and his wife Cathy have been sailing on their boat, Gael No Mara and he will set up a mediation practice when he returns.



REMEMBERING BOARD MEMBER TONY SILIPO

This month, we announce the passing of the founder of the Ontario Association of Former Parliamentarians and former NDP cabinet minster, Tony Silipo. Silipo died on Saturday March 10 at 3:15 p.m at the age of 54. A service was held at the Bernardo Funeral Home on March 13 and 14, where family and friends gathered to remember him fondly.

Silipo was very active in the community, making a career of public service. He began his political career as a trustee and later chair at the Toronto District School Board from 1978 to 1990.

In politics, Silipo was first elected to the Ontario Legislature in 1990. He was the NDP member for the Dovercourt riding. He was in Bob Rae's cabinet as Chair of the Management Board then Minister of Education from 1991 to 1993. He worked to integrate exceptional children into regular classes. He also fought cuts to social welfare. From 1993 to 1995, he was the Minister of Community and Social Services. In 1999, his riding was abolished and Silipo lost in the new riding of Davenport.

After leaving the Legislature, Silipo still worked into the community at the Workplace Safety and Insurance Appeals Tribunal. he was one of the initial board members of the Ontario Association of Former Parliamentarians and his contribution will be sorely missed. To his wife and family we convey our deepest

Pat Hayes, a former MPP, passed away on May 2, 2011, after a long battle with lung cancer.

Hayes was an Essex County politician. He served for the NDP in the Legislative, for three terms between 1985 and 1995. He was also the Mayor of Lakeshore between 1997 and 2003.





Leonard Braithwaite passed away on March 28, 2012. Braithwaite had a rich political career.

In 1963, Braithwaite was a young lawyer starting out in the Liberal Party. He was elected in Etobicoke and became Ontario's first black MPP, in opposition. He was re-elected in 1967 and 1971. He served as the Liberal Party Critic for Labour and Welfare.

Braithwaite's achievements included revoking a section of an Ontario law that allowed racial segregation in schools. He also was appointed the Order of Canada in 1997 and in 1994, received the Order of Ontario.

Braithwaite was defeated in the 1975 election. Until recently, he worked part-time in his law office. In 2011, he received the William P. Hubbard Award. Braithwaite also served in the Royal Canadian Air Force in World War Two.

Braithwaite also served as a member of the CNEA. He was on the board of directors for the CNE (Canadian National Exhibition) in 1982 and 1983.

A memorial service was held on April 21 at St. Matthias' Anglican Church.
